

Petition to Stop the Lytton Band of Pomo Indian's Land in Windsor from being transferred into Federal Trust, moving it out of local control and allowing 1500 oak trees to be cut down.

Petition summary and background	<p>Congressman Jared Huffman's legislation will move the land purchased by the Lytton Band of Pomo Indians at the western edge of Windsor into federal trust, making it exempt the land from local zoning and planning regulations. The land would become a sovereign nation. The plan will allow hundreds of homes to be built as well as a winery and 200-room resort to be developed nearby.</p> <p>The move will have a disastrous environmental impact on the land: 1,500 oak trees on the property would be cut and one of the best preserved oak woodlands in the area would be destroyed. The move will develop areas outside of Windsor's urban growth boundary, leading to developments that are incompatible with the rural nature of that land.</p>
Action petitioned for	<p>We, the undersigned, are concerned citizens and constituents of Representative Jared Huffman's who ask Representative Huffman to WITHDRAW the legislation he submitted that will move the Lytton Band of Pomo Indian's land in and near Windsor into federal trust. We also ask the Windsor Town Council to immediately pass a resolution stating that they are against moving the Lytton Band of Pomo Indian's land into federal trust. And we ask the Bureau of Indian Affairs to reject the Lytton Band of Pomo Indian's request to move their lands near and outside of Windsor, California into federal trust.</p>
